

## The Chandler Family Association Genealogy Panel - 2010 Cases

The CFA Genealogy Panel considered **72 cases** in 2010 and declined one. Some cases were handled without submission to the panelists if a CFALD report could be provided or questions answered by Dick Chandler, GP Chairman, or Claudia Brocato, Secretary. “New” in member column indicates the inquirer joined the CFA about the same time their query was submitted to the GP or as a result of the GP’s efforts. JCDCB refers to “John Chandler Descendant Chart Book.” CFALD refers to the CFA Lineages Database. DNA Group Number in **bold** indicates an **actual DNA testee or close relative of testee**. DNA Group Number with a question mark (?) indicates a supposition of genetic group. We have disguised the names of the inquirers and other living persons mentioned below to protect their privacy.
